### LIBRARY UPDATE

Have you ever read a book so good that you couldn't wait to pass it along to your friend to read? Or a book so compelling that you couldn't wait to get to your next book club meeting to discuss it? That is the idea behind the annual communitywide reading program at the Ventura County Library called One County, One Book. It is an opportunity for community members to read a selected title and participate in library programs and book discussions related to themes in the selected book. The monthlong reading program is held annually, and community members can pick up a copy of the selected book at any Ventura County Library.

This year's selection, Rough Sleepers by Tracy Kidder, is a NY Times Bestseller that tells the true story of Dr. Jim O'Connell and some of the many unhoused individuals he has worked with in his long career.

Dr. O'Connell currently serves as the President of Boston Health Care for the Homeless Program and is an Assistant Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School. In 1985, he began full-time work with people experiencing homelessness as the founding physician of the program. He established the nation's first medical respite program in 1985 and worked with the MGH Laboratory of Computer Science to design and implement the nation's first computerized medical record for a homeless program. He served as the National Program Director of the Homeless Families Program of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

As part of the 2024 One County, One Book program, Dr. O'Connell will speak on October 12 at 2PM at CSU Channel Islands (CSUCI) at the second annual Ventura County Celebration of Books. Prior to Dr. O'Connell's program, a panel of local professionals will present "The State of Homelessness in Ventura County" from 11AM to Noon in the Grand Salon on the CSUCI campus. The panel will be moderated by Amy Johnson, KCLA News Anchor. The 2024 Ventura County Celebration of Books is presented by the Ventura County Library, Ventura County Library Foundation, and CSUCI. This event is free and open to the public with no cost parking.





### FILIPINO AMERICA HISTORY MONTH




